
Andrew Holland, National Security/Energy Security Expert says NASA's Mars rover isn't the only space news right now. There was a potential breakthrough in solar energy: in space!

- Pentagon scientists just tested a solar panel in the final frontier. The goal is a future system where
 the energy collected from space solar could be sent anywhere on the earth including military
 bases.
- America's national security is rooted in its energy security. By diversifying sources of energy, we
 have the ability to act independently in our foreign policy from our domestic energy needs.
- The military of the future will require far more power even than today's military. Developments such as the solar panel in space enable the military to continue to find new sources of energy that meet the energy demands of an electric force.
- This news also raises another question: How will we protect new sources of energy from new threats?
- The Trump administration was mocked by some for launching the Space Force, but threats from foreign adversaries don't disappear once you leave the atmosphere. The militarization of space requires a unique set of weapons and strategies that we must be prepared for.
